LAMBS

Young lambs sold to \$160 (\$148) for the first pen of the day (pictured top left) sold by Pitt Sons on account of P & LM Lockyer. Shorn lambs sold to \$148 (\$150) and heavy lambs sold to \$153 (\$155) for lambs sold by IML.

SHEEP

696 (527) ewes sold to \$111 (\$100) and averaged \$91 (\$64) with a feature line of young Merino and Merino x Dohne re-stocker ewes (pictured bottom left) sold by Pitt Sons on account Corliss Bros Pty Ltd selling to \$111.

317 (116) wethers sold to \$123 (\$110) and averaged \$70 (\$73) and 44 (34) rams sold to \$180 (\$70) and averaged \$102 (\$62) with top price for Dorset rams sold by Pitt Sons on account Corlis Bros Pty Ltd . Ewes and lambs sold by CP made \$148 and the best Dorper lambs made \$148 (\$132).
