Lambs

Top price in the suckers was \$112 (\$138) for suckers sold by B&S on account Kanimbla Grazing Co. 320 (177) suckers averaged \$100 (\$121).

The top lambs (pictured top left) made \$148 (\$150) and were sold by ELD on account Weroona Partnership. 3218 (3445) lambs averaged \$111 (\$105). The top Dorper lambs (pictured left) made \$138 and were sold by LMK.

The top shorn lambs made \$135 (\$155) and were sold on account McQueen. 156 (462) shorn lambs averaged \$120 (\$92). 21 (263) hoggets sold to \$115 (\$97), averaging \$80 (\$66).

Sheep

Ewes made up the bulk of the sheep and sold to \$98 (\$100), averaging \$70 (\$58) with 1371 (1618) sold. Highlights included 5 ½ to 6 year old ewes (pictured bottom left) with lambs recently weaned, sold by G&C for M & J Fauchon for \$95. Merino x Sann ewes sold by NLP for RE & G Bomford made \$92. 72 (110) wethers sold to \$81 (\$95), averaging \$74 (\$66). Rams sold to \$76 (\$120), averaging \$61 (\$75) with 64 (114) sold.
