Numbers remained low again this week. Patrick Purtle said that the heavy lamb job has come off the pace a little in the last two to three weeks, but they're still making \$8-\$8.50/kg.

He said there was good re-stocker enquiry, although not many store lambs penned today, but, if they're there, and have a bit of style about them, there's plenty of interest, adding that the gap between store and fat lambs isn't much with everyone backing on the job getting dearer in winter. The mutton job has "the same old consistency week to week and looks very strong throughout". There was also good re-stocker interest with anything with "a store angle and a bit of youth". All in all, Patrick said if you've sold today, you'd be happy.
